## PRESENTATIVE FOOTBALL ADDRESS

---

come to this year's State Titles;

In the February 4, 2013 Sports Illustrated Super Bowl issue, Mark Oppenheimer wrote an article entitled, "In The Fields Of The Lord."

His view was that for Christian players and coaches, football is bad. He claims that football will likely corrupt their Christian values, and thus all who love and play football are corrupted as well. He argues the violence, physicality and competitiveness in playing football is "deeply at odds with Jesus' message."

His view is simply not true. First we must examine the message of Jesus. Oppenheimer says Jesus preferred the loser to the winner, the weak over the strong and the poor over the rich, but this is not an indictment against football. In fact, the essential message of these scriptures is that Jesus wants us to be team oriented. This is exactly what football teaches players. A football team requires every player to put his personal agenda below the teams. He learns to play unless each player fulfills his role on striker, defense and special teams, the entire team will suffer. Self-centeredness must give way to serving the team.

There is much in the Bible that supports the qualities needed for playing football. Many stories in the Bible tell of battles, of perseverance and of commitment. Romans 8:29 tells us God wants our character to be formed like Jesus, and football is a character building enterprise. Learning how to win and lose gracefully happens by playing football. Working hard toward a worthy goal and paying the price of self-sacrifice is learned playing football. Getting along with people who are different from you and appreciating their differences is learned playing football. The concept of stewardship is paramount in the Bible. I Corinthians 4:2 tells us that we are stewards (managers) of all that God has entrusted to us, and we are to be faithful.

Football players are given special gifts of size, speed and strength. When they fully use their gifts and excel at their sport, they are being good stewards of what God has given them. The list of people who have played the game and faithful Christ followers is a testament to the fact that it can be done.

Moses, David, Daniel, Peter and Paul were all true leaders, and tough guys who did things done for God. Jesus' bold leadership, blunt honesty and strong convictions are what drew so many followers to Him. Jesus went into the temple and cleaned house, and that is not meek and mild. Football appeals to many because it is fast, tough and filled with risk. Christianity appeals to me for exactly the same reasons. I want to be in the battle between good and evil; I want to fight for what is right, and I enjoy the challenge of doing it.

The sport of football did not unmake me as a Christian; it made me a better Christian as it has done for hundreds of thousands of others.

## PETITION OUTLINE

QCSA STATE TITLES is an annual event held to showcase the talent in our Association and allow teams to compete at the highest level of Christian Soccer in Queensland.

Identifying the highest quality players in our Association is the task of our State Organising Staff, who will select participants to compete at the AUSTRALIAN CHRISTIAN SOCCER TITLES in select age groups.

QCSA State Titles competition allows each zone or affiliate team to play against other zonal and affiliated teams nominated in their age group, and visiting teams may not play all other zones and/or affiliate teams depending on the draw.

In the purpose of the 2019 QCSA STATE TITLES, it is recognised that our largest zone in the Association, the Sunshine Coast, is divided into two zones known as Sunshine Coast North and Sunshine Coast South. All other affiliates are entered as individual entities North, South East and West.

The competition supports the Fair Play guidelines as set out by the QCSA and FAIR PLAY.

Teams, coaches, managers and spectators are to compete within the spirit of the guidelines at all times both on and off the field.

QCSA State Titles organising committee reserves the right to alter the competition program, ground, or match times at any time during the competition.

Notification of these changes will be given to the zone coordinators affected by the change. It will be the responsibility of this person to ensure the information is forwarded to all the teams involved.

event that two or more teams have the same number of points the State champion will be determined by (in order of priority) goal difference, then most goals scored, then relevant result against other joint team. If two teams still be equal then they will be declared Joint Age State champions.

## **PERPETUAL TROPHIES**

---

and affiliates will be awarded points on the basis of the outcome of each Age State Champion competitions.

In any particular age group teams are declared joint champions, both teams receive 3.5 points, there will be no points awarded for the second place; third place will be third place receiving 2 points and 1 point for fourth place.

In age groups where a zone has more than one team participating, only the highest placed team in that particular age group will receive points towards any awards.

In deciding the winners of trophies (QCSA STATE CHAMPION TROPHY (ERIC JONES CUP), MAROOCHY SHIRE BICENTENNIAL TROPHY, AIS SENIOR TROPHY, BEAUT TROPHIES JUNIOR TROPHY) should two or more zones be level on points, then the zone with a superior goal difference will decide the winner. If still level, the zone with the most goals scored will be declared the winner.

### **A STATE CHAMPION TROPHY – THE ERIC JONES CUP**

Eric Jones was the founding president of the QCSA in 1968. Fifty years later, and still very much an active part of our Association through his work with the Stone Welsh Soccer Club.

The winner of THE ERIC JONES CUP will be the zone that receives the highest number of points over all the age competitions.

### **SENIOR CUP**

The winner of the AUSTRALIAN INSURANCE SOLUTIONS SENIOR CUP will be the zone that receives the highest number of points over all SENIOR competitions at the tournament.



## **U BEAUT TROPHIES JUNIOR CUP**

The winner of the U BEAUT TROPHIES JUNIOR CUP will be the zone that receives the highest number of points over all JUNIOR competitions held at the tournament.

## **MAROOCHY SHIRE BICENTENNIAL TROPHY**

The Maroochy Shire Bi-Centennial Trophy is to be awarded to the Champion. The Champion Team is the team gaining the highest percentage points. Percentage points will be calculated by dividing the points gained by the maximum achievable in each age group and multiplying same by 100.

## **ONE GOAL DIFFERENCE TROPHY**

ONE GOAL DIFFERENCE TROPHY is presented to the Zone with the highest goal difference for the State Titles.

In each Zone, all the goals scored will be totaled (across all age groups) and all goals conceded will be deducted from that total.

The zone with the highest positive goal difference will be declared the winner. If two zones are equal on goal difference, they will be declared joint winners.

## **BEST TEAM GOAL AVERAGE TROPHY**

BEST TEAM GOAL AVERAGE is awarded to the team that has the BEST GOAL AVERAGE (HIGHEST) achieved by the total number of goals scored divided by games played. If two teams are equal then the team with the best goal average AND the lowest against goal average shall be declared the winner. If three or more teams are still equal then the teams will be declared joint winners.

## **STATE TITLE AGE CHAMPION TROPHIES**

It is decided that as new life members were accepted by the Association, they should be revered by having a QCSA State Titles Champion Trophy named in their honour. To date, the following have all had this accolade bestowed upon

## PETITION RULES

Some competition rules apply to the QCSA 2019 STATE TITLES as they do for normal QCSA competition and these are available on the QCSA website [qcsa.org.au](http://qcsa.org.au). Club skins may be worn for the QCSA STATE TITLES competition in 2019.

Acceptance is that you are allowed to put 16 players on a match card for any game (instead of the usual 15 players). Same interchange rules apply as normal QCSA competition.

Yellow cards that are accrued during the QCSA 2019 STATE TITLES do not carry over into the normal QCSA/SSCCSA competition. However, penalties that must be served and completed in total within the structure of the STATE TITLES will carry over into the QCSA/SSCCSA Fixture Competition. 3 yellows in 3 games = 1 red card.

Red cards given out during the QCSA 2019 STATE TITLES, will be dealt with during this competition, in the fact that players will be suspended from matches for as many games the offence committed is deemed worthy by discipline. Serious offences will be dealt with by an appropriate Discipline Panel convened specifically for that purpose. If this suspension carries over into the normal QCSA/SSCCSA competition, you will miss the relevant amount of matches in the QCSA/SSCCSA competition.

Officials, coach, manager, player, spectator or neutral person not adhering to the rules of the competition as accepted by QCSA, or not acting within the spirit of the rules will be dealt with by QCSA in the first instance. Further action if deemed necessary will be taken in all cases.
